About the Program

The PhD in Leadership and Change enters its third decade of innovation from a position of strength. Its paradigm-shifting low-residency, cohort-and competency-based program is designed to serve experienced practitioners in a wide array of sectors, roles and professions. The outcomes-based curriculum blends face-to-face and hybrid residencies with uniquely designed virtual technologies to support a dynamic, geographically dispersed and networked global learning community. Our model addresses the knowledge and capabilities scholars need to conduct bold research that can have positive impacts on leading change for equitable and sustainable futures in organizations and communities around the globe. Our student demographic profile in terms of age, race/ethnicity, gender, sector and geography is extremely diverse; and the faculty profile as well, is a diverse, interdisciplinary and passionate team of senior professors.

Over the first two decades, we have educated 320 alumni and have 150 active current students. We are proud to report an 80% graduation rate, which is well above the national average; and 35% alumni giving rate in the past year alone, which is also well above the national average.

Candidate Qualifications

Successful applicants must have: substantial experience in academic administration at departmental chair or higher levels in not-for-profit or public universities; a creative approach to leading strategically and managing wisely; substantial experience with graduate students, preferably doctoral-level, and serving on dissertation committees; an interest in and experience with utilizing academic technologies for innovative teaching and learning; excellent communication and project management skills; and, a commitment to the critical role education has as a force for democracy and the common good. A history of building innovative degree and/or non-degree programming a strong plus. Successful candidates must hold a doctorate in an area related to our interdisciplinary curriculum awarded in or prior to 2015 and an established record of research, scholarship and practice equivalent to the level of Full Professor.

The position reports to the Graduate School's Dean and works closely with the University Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs. Antioch's recent announcement of its robust future as a founding member of a new higher education system of affiliated mission-aligned universities holds much promise for growth and innovation ahead for the Graduate School and University at large.

- Visioning and managing a high-quality, non-traditional, mission-aligned interdisciplinary, geographically dispersed doctoral program;
