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The battle for wisdom in leaders

Leadership is defined by followers, not by academics or persons in power. In democracies followers choose their leaders, more so than in corporate life and certainly than in dictatorships. These public battles have changed dramatically due to the Digital Civil Revolution, giving more power and influence to citizens, as I analyzed in my book 'Civil Leadership as the Future of Leadership'. In the end these battles and leadership choices not only show the vision of the people on public and political leadership, but it will also influence the general opinion, in all contexts, about the definition of and preferences in modern leadership. So we, researchers and practitioners, can observe if these powerful followers by choosing their leaders acknowledge and prefer wisdom in these leaders and especially, if any, what kind of wisdom.

Actual battles for public leadership that can be very telling, are Zelensky versus Putin, Biden versus Trump and Tuss versus Sinak. In my book I analyzed Macron I (France), Zelensky (Ukrain) and Jacinda Ardern (New Zealand) as examples of the new kind of leaders that arise thanks to a better and more authentic use of the modern ICT- and media technology, acknowledging this new power of citizens.

At the Round Table I am hosting at the ILA conference in Washington (Saturday, October 15, 16:25-17:40 EDT) I hope to learn from your insights in this ongoing battle for (public) leadership and how wisdom in leaders is defined and stimulated. Will this modern battle lead to the right, wise civil leadership?

Steven P.M. de Waal, PhD, is a strategic consultant, entrepreneur and chairman of multiple non-executive boards. He combines his extensive experience in the boardroom with research and academic reflection. Dr. De Waal's writing focuses on strategic thinking, practical wisdom for executives and social entrepreneurship. He has published many books and articles, and he has given numerous interviews and lectures for mainly an executive audience. In 2019 he was invited to lecture about the book 'Civil Leadership as the Future of Leadership' from New Zealand, to Canada, Sillicon Valley and many countries in Europe.

His dissertation (2014) conceptualized civil leadership and researched civil leaders' values patterns in the different private-sector contexts.

He launched one of the first think tanks in the Netherlands, Public SPACE, which aims to stimulate active citizenship and social entrepreneurship.

Investigating Boundary Conditions for Shared Leadership - Team Performance Relationship: A Team Leadership Coordination Perspective

Shared leadership is believed to be beneficial for team effectiveness. Researchers, however, have not always found positive effects. We suggest that scholarly attention should not merely focus on optimizing team input for shared leadership, but also considers leaders' coordination during shared leadership. The present research identifies expertise recognition accuracy and task-knowledge coordination as important leaders' coordination contingencies that strengthen the effects of shared leadership on team performance. Our study helps resolve theoretical controversies about whether shared leadership influences team performance and provides empirical and practical insights into how leadership coordination can drive higher team performance during shared leadership.

Promoting Wisdom in Professional Graduate Leadership Students: A Book Evaluation Group Project

Every year, large volumes of new information offer to help leadership students become better leaders. As some information has little scholarly foundation, leadership educators face the challenge of pointing students toward well supported ideas and away from poorly supported ideas. During an intervention in an MBA leadership course, 116 student teams critically evaluated recent books on leadership. Results suggest acceptable interest in the assignment and numerous examples of insights where students integrated - or challenged - new content relative to research-based course concepts and personal experiences. With further development, the principles in this paper will contribute to developing wisdom through leadership education.

CONCURRENT SESSION PRESENTATION FORMATS

The ILA uses the following definitions to create shared expectations between presenters and attendees.

CONVERSATION WITH

Come ready to ask your questions during these Q&A style sessions with leadership luminaries.

PANEL

An informed discussion and/or debate on a topic by panelists with contrasting or complementary points of view, moderated by a chairperson, with time reserved for audience participation, questions, and comments. Film Panels also include showing clips or short films.

PRESENTATION(S)

A stand-alone presentation or multiple presentations that were individually accepted and grouped together by the program team into a session focused broadly on a theme or approach. The session chair introduces each presentation, keeps time, and facilitates the question and answer portion.

SYMPOSIUM

Individual papers/presentations that were submitted together as a wholistic session exploring a common subject. Chairs frame the session, introduce presenters, keep time, and help move the conversation along. Commentators, if listed, moderate questions to create a rich discussion among presenters and attendees

WORKSHOP

Rooted in audience participation and active learning, half or more of the time is spent on experiential learning and innovative, interactive participation focused on learning a new skill, methodology, or technique. While this looks a little different in a virtual environment, facilitators may utilize things like small breakout rooms, white boards, polls, and other interactive virtual conference features.

OTHER FORMATS

INTERACTIVE ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION

Interactive Roundtable Discussions are small group discussions on a topic of common interest facilitated by an individual or team. The organizer frames the topic and then facilitates a discussion with participants. After 23 minutes, participants have the opportunity to move to another roundtable or remain where they are to continue the conversation.

POSTER

A visual display of research, projects, papers, or programs. During a Hosted Poster Session, posters will be staffed by the presenter(s).

- Contributing to the body of leadership scholarship and leadership development by advancing rigorous research, identifying best practices, and partnering with publishers.





